Around the Lodge in bits and pieces

During the Sept. 2 meeting **Event Center Secretary Suzi Aadland** reported:

The two-stick golf tournament was 'very successful' with approximately 84 golfing and 32 in the Corn Hole tournament. Music for the event was donated by Mike Hermanson and was "excellent and greatly appreciated."

There is sufficient money to begin renovations to the bar. With regard to the golf course, work remains on the bathrooms between Holes 5 and 6. Some bridges on the golf course will need to be replaced in the near future. Some trees have been marked to be cut down.

Lodge Board Chairman Doug Hamilton reported that the Lodge has been given a \$1,500 grant by Grand Lodge to offset financial situations caused by Covid 19. Members voted to give \$1,000 to the Cornerstone Mission for veterans and retain \$500 for future needs.

It was noted that the State Elks convention has been cancelled and will be conducted via Zoom on Oct. 10 beginning at 8:30 a.m.

The Rapid City Lodge contest will be announced sometime in January/February 2021 with the contest completed by the end of March. There will be no state, regional or national Hoop Shoot contests this year.

National Veterans Service Committee Chairman Neil Harris has been hard at it within the limitations imposed by Covid 19.

During the July 15 the Fort Meade VA quarterly volunteer service meeting (conducted telephonically) the staff asked for help procuring items for 58 women veterans at Fort Meade.

Aug. 10 Harris delivered 58 bottles of body lotion and 58 journal books to support the Women's Program along with four cases of sodas and three rolls of quarters to Mike Ellis, recreation therapist to take to Fort Meade. The staff has been able to conduct impromptu Bingo events with the Lodge's support.

Aug. 19 Harris took two bird feeders and two bags of bird seed to Ellis to transport. The July hail storms destroyed all the feeders on the campus.

Harris again noted appreciation for the financial assistance of the Aberdeen, Watertown and Deadwood lodges in helping support the needs of veterans receiving care in the Black Hill VA system.
