National Veterans Service Committee Chairman Neil Harris is keeping up the relay support system for veterans at the Fort Meade Medical Center.

In his October report to the lodge he explained that six electric razors, on hair clipper, five bird feeders and two bags of bird seed plus some cal-

endars and holiday greeting cards were delivered to Mike Ellis, recreation therapist, to take to Fort Meade which was still in lockdown because of a resurgence of the virus.

Some of the vets were in serious need of the personal hygiene items they had requested, Harris said, "So we were glad to be able to help with those."

Ellis indicated they feel they will now have enough bird feeders to replace the ones destroyed in summer hailstorms.

Bird watching is great distraction for the veterans who appreciate the lodge support in obtaining the items.
