# Around the Lodge in bits and pieces



Suzi Aadland was named Elk of the Month for March by ER Rod Holmes in recognition of her active support of the lodge, helping iwth games, taking minutes for the Event Center meetings and coming up with ideas for events.

During the March 17 Lodge meeting Event Center Secretary Suzi Aadland reported that work is underway on the 'Pizza Hut' (restrooms) at the junction of Fairways 3, 5 and 6 and when completed should be similar to Hole 12 restrooms.

Lodge Board Chairman Doug Hamilton reported that the Lodge is checking into getting a remote rope feed on the flag pole versus moving the pole to make it easier and safer to raise and lower the flag.

At the March 3 Lodge meeting retiring National Veterans Service Committee Chairman Neil Harris reviewed his February activities on behalf of vets served by the VA Black Hills Health Care Systems at Fort Meade and Hot Springs.

Feb. 24 he delivered sodas, potato chips, chocolate bars, candy and a \$500 gift certificate from Vanway Trophy to Mike Ellis to take to Fort Meade where staff have been able, once again, to sponsor activities for the vets, Harris said. The snack items will be used during the game playing and crafts projects.

The Vanway gift will allow the BHHCS to provide trophies and prizes for vets competing Locally in the annual National Veterans Creative Arts Festival. It has no expiration date so it can be used in subsequent years as well.

The Black Hills System was host to the 2006 National Festival and considers it a 'big deal' Harris said.

Upcoming activities will be dictated by COVID-19 virus requirements for the near future, Harris said.

According to the March 3 minutes, the Lodge held a dart tournament Feb. 20 with 11 teams and 22 players taking part. ER Holmes' team took second place and "everyone had a great time Sally Farrar, Heard Editor."
